## \$30,000 grant will support the Orchestra Summer Concert Series

December 8, 2010ô *Philadelphia, PA* ô Rocco Landesman, Chairman of the National Endowment for the Arts, has announced that The Mann Center for the Performing Arts has been approved for a grant of \$30,000 to support the Orchestra Summer Concert Series. The Mann Center is one of 1,057 not-for-profit organizations recommended for a grant as part of the federal agencyøs first round of fiscal year 2011 grants. In total, the Arts Endowment will distribute \$26.68 million to support projects nationwide.

An independent agency of the federal government, the National Endowment for the Arts advances artistic excellence, creativity, and innovation for the benefit of individuals and communities. NEA Chairman Rocco Landesman said, õI continue to be impressed with the creative, innovative, and excellent projects brought forward by arts organizations across the country.
