THE MANN PRESENTS ITS FIRST FREE, FAMILY ARTS FESTIVAL – PHILADELPHIA ON PARADE – WITH GRANT FROM PNC ARTS ALIVE Day-Long Celebration Emphasizes World Music & Stars More Than 1,000 Performers

PHILADELPHIA (April 27, 2011) – Saturday, May 21st will mark an exciting first for Philadelphia-area families when the Mann Center for the Performing Arts presents PHILADELPHIA ON PARADE, a free "family, friends and fun festival" from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. featuring more than 1,000 performers. Funded through the PNC Arts Alive program, PHILADELPHIA ON PARADE will put the spotlight on the diversity of world music with a line-up that includes everything from classical, gospel, funk and swing to Asian-inspired rock, jazz, blues, African dance and drum and even an appearance by PBS Kids' favorite RAGGS and their "Live Dance" party.

The PNC Arts Alive program is a five-year, \$5 million investment from the PNC Foundation that supports visual and performing arts groups with the goal of increasing arts access and engagement.

The festival kicks off at 11 a.m. with a Mardi Gras-style parade, complete with a jazz brass band and an invitation for all to get in on the fun by strutting along behind the band. From there, the festival explodes throughout the Mann's campus in Fairmount Park with artists and acts scheduled across five stages. The performances range from 15 to 30 minutes – perfect for the young and young at heart – and are staggered to ensure that audience members can catch as many shows as possible. In addition to music, the CIGNA Children's Pavilion will feature storytellers, jugglers, balloon artists, and demonstrations for guests to try jump roping, Irish dance and Chinese lion dancing. There will also be arts and crafts stations for little hands, face painters and plenty of fun festival foods and concessions. Plus, families are welcome to bring picnics to enjoy.

"We are very proud to present a day at the Mann that belongs to families and friends of all ages and from all walks of life," said Catherine M. Cahill, president and CEO of the Mann. "The Mann is known as Philadelphia's summer music home and what better way to get the season started than by opening our doors – for free! – to the entire Philadelphia region for a day filled with music, dance and art. We are especially pleased that the PNC Arts Alive program embraced PHILADELPHIA ON PARADE by granting us one of just 27 awards that they presented to arts organizations in Philadelphia and South Jersey. Certainly, PNC's generosity is helping us extend the reach and access for an event like this and helping us to further our community engagement work, which annually impacts more than 50,000 children in the tri-state region," she said.

"The PNC Foundation has a long history of providing grants to non-profit organizations that strengthen and enrich the lives of our neighbors," said Bill Mills, regional president of PNC for Philadelphia and Southern New Jersey, speaking on behalf of the PNC Foundation. "We understand the valuable return that investing in the arts can deliver.
